It was a busy weekend of sport last week with Volleyball, Touch, and Athletics all competing in their various tournaments.

- It was a hot day on Saturday with perfect conditions for the Canterbury Secondary Schools' Athletics finals at Rawhiti Domain. The results follow are as follows: Goiteom Gebremedihin, Senior Boys' 1500m 2nd, 800m 3rd, Jared Neighbours, Intermediate Boys' 100m Hurdles 1st, Javelin 2nd, Max McClimont, Junior Boys' Shot-put 5th, Laura Clarke, Intermediate Girls' 800m 5th, 400m 5th, Derand Marais, Senior Boys' Triple jump 4th, Karan Kumar, Junior Boys' Discus 7th. These students will be heading away to the South Island Secondary Schools' tournament in Timaru in two weeks time.
- The Senior Boys' Touch team placed 9th overall at the South Island Championships. After a poor performance and loss against Burnside, the boys lifted, beating Roncalli 10 1. A hard fought battle against Southland Boys' resulting in a loss, meant that to have any chance to qualify for the nationals, they needed to win their remaining games. The performance of the day was a draw against the top Nelson Boys' team. Following this was a loss against Otago Boys'. The next day we had one game, and had a great win against Marlborough 8 1. A tournament full of lessons, which will serve us well heading into our Australian tour later in the year. Thanks to the staff and parents for their excellent support.
- The Senior Girls' Volleyball team competed in the Canterbury Secondary Schools' Volleyball Championships. The girls came up against some tough competition in their first match, and lost to the national champs, Burnside High. Despite the loss, they took Lincoln High and Rangi Ruru to 5 sets, but couldn't quite get the win. In their play-off for 9th and 10th, the girls had a great game beating Rangiora High to place 9th. Congratulations to Riteta Fili-Matua who made the tournament team.

The girls will play in the South Island Satellite Tournament during Summer Tournament week, 5th-7th April, at Pioneer Stadium. The team came third in this year's premiere Division 2 schools competition, where they went to 5 sets against Linwood, winning 3-2.

Well done to the Year 9 Volleyball team who won its Monday night competition. The girls played off for first and second against Marian College, and with a big crowd of supporters, the game went to 5 sets with the girls winning to take out top honours in the Year 9 grade.

Despite the summer sport season winding down, there are still plenty of events to keep the students busy and active.
