## **Students in the Community**

An area of wetland damaged by fire in 2014 was restored to its former glory with help from Papanui High students and the University of Canterbury Student Volunteer Army (SVA). In 2014, vandals drove a car into Halswell Quarry destroying an area of native planting before setting fire to a section of boardwalk.

In March students from Papanui High, alongside the UC SVA, took on the restoration project as part of the SVA's UCan volunteer programme and in the space of a few hours transformed the wetland area. The UCan programme encourages local secondary students to become leaders in their communities through volunteering while being mentored by SVA members.



Despite a rainy day, around 35 Year 12 and 13 students arrived eager to get to work. One crew set about rebuilding the damaged boardwalk, another group cleared around young native plantings and another group used bark mulch to restore the pathway.

Christchurch City Council park rangers Nigel Morritt and Robbie Hewson worked alongside the volunteers.

"It was an amazing effort. In the space of a few hours the volunteers transformed the area. With the boardwalk repaired, track mulched and native plants released, all traces of the fire were gone. The students were full of energy and enthusiasm for the project and were a credit to their schools and the organisation."

We had some fantastic results from the five swimmers who attended the Canterbury Secondary Schools' Swimming Champs.

- Cassie Wright broke two records; she came 1st in the 16-18 year Girls' 50m
  Backstroke breaking her previous record from last year of 31.28 seconds, with a
  new record of 29.39 seconds, Cassie then went on to come first and break the
  record in the Open Girls' 100m Backstroke with a new time of 1.04.66 (previous
  was 1.04.78)
- Our Junior Girls 14 year old 200m Freestyle relay came 1st with three swimmers still in the 12-13 year age group. Bella and Ruby Wagenvoord, Courtney Linkhorne, and Claudia Rogers.
- Ruby Wagenvoord finished 4th in the Open Girls' 100m Breaststroke, and won her age group 14 year old girls' 50m Breaststroke, five seconds faster than 2nd place.
- Bella Wagenvoord finished 2nd in the girls 12-13 age 50m Breaststroke and 4th in the open Girl Individual Medley.
- Courtney Linkhorne finished 5th in the Girls' 12-13 50m Butterfly
- Claudia Rogers finished 9th out of 32 swimmers in the Girls' 12-13 age 50m Freestyle.

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
