Welcome back to our first newsletter following the holiday break. We made a minor breakthrough in regard to our "buildings" over that period. Under 22 PAI Joshua Christie: 8th Long jump, 2nd 100m, 1st Shot put, Discus 3rd.

The students hope to travel to Auckland in December to compete at the National Secondary Schools' Athletics.

Last weekend Jade Taylor competed at the New Zealand Karate open. She won 3 gold and 1 silver medal.

Jade reports *"In the team kata my team and I placed first in the 14-17 female division, and 2nd in the 16+ female team kata, we lost against New Caledonia in the final.
