Fundraising Meeting

Outdoor Education

Term 1 was action packed for Year 10, 12, and 13 Outdoor Education classes. The Year 12's had the opportunity to climb a few hills in the Craigieburn area, and experienced some scree running (something many trampers do not get the opportunity to do, if sticking to tracks). Their second expedition saw them going up the Hawdon Valley, and were lucky enough to hear kiwi at night, and witnessed the release of three endangered Orange Crested Parakeets.

The Year 13 class started the year by completing the Cass Lagoon in some of the best summer weather we have ever had. The students were working towards their bush craft assessment which saw them lighting fires with wet wood, bunking down in their own man made bivouacs, completing river crossings, and pack floating. Their second trip took them to Mt Somers. They were treated to hut living and made the most of it. The trip was completed during the roar and they heard deer roaring in the distance. The sky was incredibly clear, and many sat outside to watch the stars. Over the last couple of weeks the pupils have been visiting the Waimakariri River to complete river crossings and pack floating. No mean feat when the water is freezing and I have been particularly proud of their efforts.

Year 10's were treated to a day at The Groynes, completing a high and low ropes course with the staff and students from Horizons. Everyone had a good time, with many asking to return for another trip.

Term 2 brings more excitement with the Year 10's going rock climbing, and the Year 11's going on a field trip looking at land formations, and a few weekly trips of orienteering, rock climbing, and mountain biking. The Year 12 class has just completed an outdoor first aid course, and they will be mountain biking each week culminating in a trip to Hanmer Springs for three days. The Year 13's are also completing their outdoor first aid in the Hawdon Valley, and will be soon begin their adventure based learning unit, incorporating how to run low ropes courses.





I am sure there will be many a tale to tell at the end of Term 2 as well.
