Reggie Dabbs also spoke with a group of Year 12 student leaders, and shared some of his personal stories and struggles with them, in order to inspire them as part of their leadership journey.

On Tuesday, during the day, we held our school cross country. Congratulations to all participants, especially those who were successful in gaining placings, and we wish them all the best as they continue to seek higher honours at both Canterbury and national level.

On Tuesday evening we held our Open Night from 6.30pm to 8.30pm, and welcomed over 1000 visitors, both parents and prospective students to our school.
