Outdoor Education Emergency First Aid Care Trip

The Year 13 Outdoor Education class left a sunny Christchurch, to head to the misty hills of the Hawdon Valley for a three day course in Emergency Outdoor First Aid Care, an extension from their Outdoor First Aid course in Year 12. The students spent the days acting out scenarios that are likely to occur in the New Zealand Mountains (there were definitely some students who should be majoring in Drama after their performances!). The students took on leadership roles of the first responder, the first aider, the group help, and the person to call in for emergency services. Each scenario took around 40 minutes, with students having to care for their injured, sick, or critically injured patients until they recovered or were evacuated. Students learned how to call emergency services, how to relay information appropriately, and how to seek advice for their patient. This was an invaluable course, with skills students will be able to transfer into their everyday lives.
