This week has again seen many of our students participating in authentic learning experiences across a range of activities. Our students gain so much from these experiences and we thank the teachers, parents and other supporters for their help in making them happen.

Congratulations to our music students who competed recently in the Jazz Quest competition in Christchurch and the Southern Jam competition in Blenhiem. The Papanui High School Big Band won gold at both the Jazz Quest and Southern Jam competitions, whilst the Jazz Combo band won silver at both events. These are outstanding achievements, as the level of competition was extremely high. Well done to all the students and staff involved.

The cold and wet weather we experienced at the start of this week ,did not deter our Year 12 Outdoor Education students who traveled to Flock Hill to have their authentic learning in the snow. Additionally our senior hospitality students and our Year 11 Drama students presented our annual dinner theatre event on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. The hospitality students provided a catered meal to invited guests followed by Year 11 Drama students performing some Shakespeare and comedy scenes as part of their Level 1 Drama assessment. Both evenings were very successful and a wonderful example of authentic learning and assessment.

On Thursday evening we held our Senior Course Selection Information Evening for current Year 11 and 12 students. This was a wonderful opportunity for both parents and students to hear about the many courses and subjects that are on offer at Papanui High School as well as interact with more than 24 external tertiary providers. I was pleased to see so many Year 12s and their families at Course Selection last night. I know many Year 12s are weighing up their options for next year. There are some who are planning to leave school and attend tertiary courses in 2018 while others will be contemplating returning for Year 13. I do encourage all students to carefully consider what their best course of action is, based on their own needs and future career pathway.

For those who are returning it is very important that they actively research tertiary courses and career pathways now so they ensure that they have the right subjects next year. This is especially important if they require University Entrance, as they must have at least 3 UE approved subjects as part of their Year 13 course. If they are at all unsure of this they should consult the course selection booklet and talk to their Academic Counsellor.

It is however, still important to keep focus on Year 12. There is not much class time left this year, so all Year 12s should be ensuring they put in maximum effort to ensure success. Achieving Level 2 will allow students access to their chosen tertiary course, even for those planning to do Year 13. When students apply for university courses and halls of residence next year they will do so with their Year 12 grades as they will not have completed their Year 13 courses at that stage.

I do wish all Year 12s the best with making these important decisions about their future.

Brittany Terrey is the only South Island member of the NZ U19 Junior White Soxs team that travelled to Florida USA in July to compete in the U19 Softball World Series.

The team travelled over to the US two weeks prior to the Championships to train and prepare for the series. The team played against Australia in a warm up game to then meet Puerto Rico, Czech Republic, Dominican Republic, India and Italy in pool play.

There best result was a 12-0 win over India which was also her personal best game where she pitched. Overall the team placed 16/25 with Brittany being ranked 5th in ERA (earned runs average) as no runs were scored against her.

Technology is changing fast and our education system needs to grow and adapt with it. We are changing how we equip our children and young people to participate, create, and thrive in this fast-evolving digital world.

What is Digital Technologies & Hangarau Matihiko (DT & HM)?


Digital Technologies & Hangarau Matihiko is about teaching our tamariki and children how technology works, and how they can use that knowledge to solve problems.

Once this new curriculum is introduced, our kids won't just be using devices like computers and smart phones. The changed curriculum will mean that schools will be teaching our young people the computer science principles that all digital technologies are built on.

Your child will benefit from having these future thinking skills.



Timeline: DT & HM curriculum content, from consultation to implementation



What will change for my child?

All students from year 1 to year 13 (ages 5 to 18 roughly) will have the opportunity to learn DT & HM. Students will be able to specialise from year 11 to year 13. We are starting with NCEA Level 1 achievement standards, which will be available for use from 2018. Levels 2 and 3 will be made available from 2019.

Many teachers, schools, kura and Kāhui Ako are already making digital technologies learning part of their teaching programmes. This change ensures that all students get these experiences, to prepare them for a world where digital skills are increasingly valuable to the economy and wider society.

Introducing progress outcomes to Technology

To ensure that our learners have rich learning experiences in Digital Technologies, *The New Zealand Curriculum* must provide clear, accessible expectations for what students will learn.

Progress outcomes clearly describe the significant steps learners take as they progress in Digital Technologies from school entry to the end of Year 13.

For example, when looking at programming (in the Digital Technologies), progress outcomes identify that students start by learning to program simple instructions in-person (such as stepping out a set of actions on the floor). Later progress outcomes describe how this learning progresses over time, for example students can develop software or program robots.

How can you be involved?

Support your child to learn all that they can about Digital Technologies & Hangarau Matihiko. Help your children understand that technology gives them the tools; but they still need to know how to work together, communicate, lead, and plan in order to succeed.

We encourage you to speak with your school or kura, or Board of Trustees about their plans on integrating the Digital Technologies & Hangarau Matihiko curriculum into their teaching and learning programmes.
