We, along with Burnside High School and Lincoln High School, have six year 12 and 13 students involved with a LEOTC opportunity through Gap Filler to create a game for the Super Street Arcade Game in town - the massive joystick and screen on/outside the Vodafone Building on Tuam St. This is part of the students Digital Technologies subject and all their credits link to this project. This has been a year long project with the students presenting their conceptual designs to all involved earlier this year and have then gone on to develop their initial ideas through to a digital technology outcome which has included creating the code, graphics and sound.

On Thursday 7th September we had the opportunity to go into central Christchurch and test our games live on the big screen! This is invaluable and the students enjoyed being able to see what they had created on the big screen, see that their game actually worked plus all the bugs/issues they now need to sort and received some really valuable feedback from from a range of people including industry experts.
