Staff have received training and instruction earlier this term and next week during the combined assemblies on Tuesday 26 September, ALL students will receive instructions from Harrison Tew staff on the revised/updated lock down procedures for Papanui High School.

The primary purpose of these procedures is to ensure the safety of students, staff and visitors at Papanui High School during an incident that would result in a lock down.

It is anticipated that the school will conduct a lock down exercise/drill during the first 3 weeks of term 4. Parents and caregivers will be notified of this exercise closer to the time via email and our school website.



'Expect Trains'

As you may know trains are now running on the Main North Line during both day and night.

The rail line has been closed since the November earthquake and we need to make sure people have not become complacent around the railway. Our team have reported that they often see teenage students walking to and from school along the network and we need to ensure that this stops and that they remain safe now that trains are operating during both day and night.

Our key safety messages are:

Always expect trains from either direction and at any time
If you are in a car, always slow down as you're approaching a level crossing and be prepared to STOP
Look out for trains, and obey signs and signals
Stay off railway tracks. Only cross the railway at approved railway level crossing points.
