

THE EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME! SWIMMING CANTERBURY WEST COAST ATHLETES TO COMPETE IN CHINA

Congratulations to Ruby Wagenvoord (Y13) on being selected as the only female swimmer from Swimming Canterbury West Coast, to compete at the 44th Annual Wuhan International Yangtze River Crossing Festival – in Wuhan the capital city of China's Hubei Province, and Christchurch's sister city on the 16th July.

The 1800m race attracts swimmers from around the world, and offers prize money ranging from USD\$500 to \$20,000 for the top 30 places.

Because this event is not just about swimming, but also about promoting Christchurch and honouring the bond between the sister cities, part of the selection involved finding the best ambassadors for Christchurch.

Four short-listed athletes underwent a formal interview with the management team at ChristchurchNZ, who then made their final selection.

We look forward to hearing from Ruby when she returns from her amazing adventure.

Boys' 1st XI – had their first game of the season on Wednesday, just going down to Riccarton 3-2. A great effort by the team.


