If your child is cold they can wear a white thermal under their uniform.

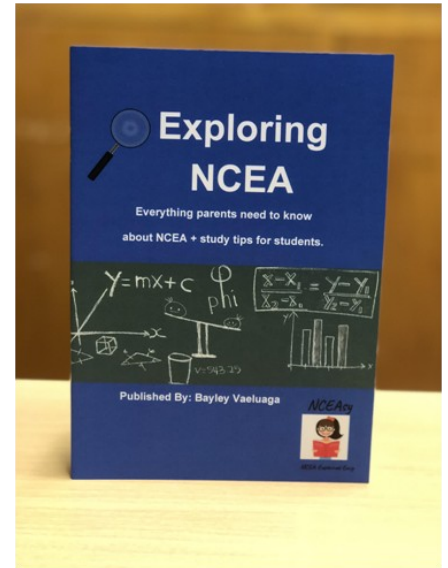

The trip kicks off with a tour of Massey University, Wellington campus. Massey offers an extensive range of degree options across multiple disciplines spanning Fine Arts, Craft, Industrial Design, Film, Photography, Graphics and permutations across all arts disciplines. The University allowed us access to all Departments and gave the students a comprehensive look, while allowing plenty of time for our students to ask questions and to get a feel for the campus including accommodation options.

Christchurch Netball Centre Representative Teams

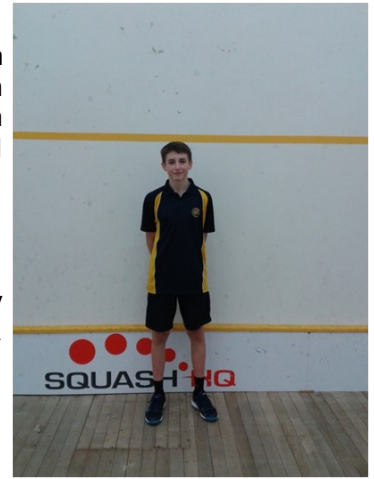

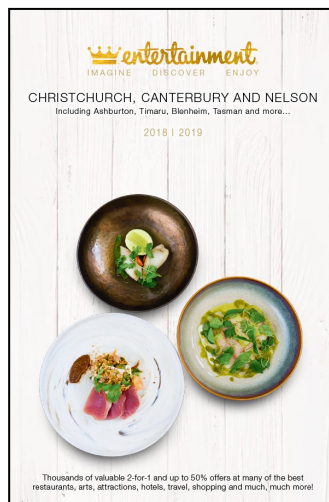
