I am hopeful that the extended long weekend provided students with a well timed break, and an opportunity to recharge, as we move in to the second half of this term. The Teacher Only Day provided an opportunity for our staff to focus on three key areas that support our Strategic Plan, which is designed to increase engagement for learning. The three areas of focus are Wellbeing, Culturally Responsive Practice, and Digital Citizenship. It is important that the staff have an opportunity to share best practice, and work collaboratively. The day was very productive, and contributes to our ongoing cycle of continuous improvement to support student achievement.

Recently, I have been overseas with our Director of International Students, speaking in schools, to agents, and to families in relation to our international students. 
Australian Gymnastics Championships
