I would like to start by acknowledging and congratulating, the students who attended the senior formal last Friday week. Digital Citizenship Beyond the School Gates

What is cyberbullying? <u>According to Netsafe</u>, cyberbullying is when a person uses digital technology to send, post or publish content with the intention to harm another person or a group. This behaviour is often aggressive, is repeated and involves some kind of power imbalance between the people involved.

Cyberbullying can take many forms:

- name calling online
- repeated unwanted online messages
- spreading rumours or lies
- fake accounts used to harass people
- excluding people from social activities
- embarrassing pictures, videos, websites, or fake profiles

What is the difference between traditional bullying and cyberbullying? As our young people are often connected online all the time. This means, they can't get away from cyberbullying. We encourage families to have a conversation about the amount of time spent online, and whether young people need access to their device after bedtime. We often observe that young people don't choose to switch off to protect themselves. They may need you to prompt them.

Our advice is if you think your teenager is being cyberbullied, read Netsafe's options for dealing with cyberbullying.

 - If your child is the bully...
- Ask:
 - What strategies can you and your teenager use if s/he is victim of cyberbullying?
 - How can you encourage your teenager to talk to you about cyberbullying?

Brain Bee Competition

Four Year 11 students travelled to Dunedin this week to compete in the Brain Bee competition, a neuroscience quiz, held at the University of Otago. They competed individually and as a team answering questions about brain physiology and anatomy, neurotransmitters and diseases. In the individual competition, two students made the semi-final, and one continued to the final. Unfortunate not to receive a place, the group was really happy with their success. In the group competition the team took out 3rd place. As well as the competition, the group were treated to a lecture from a professor of neuroscience and a series of laboratory activities in the electrical stimulation labs, which gave them a taste of being first year students at the university.

On Tuesday the 19th of June, the Papanui Jazz Combo, under the tutelage of Steve Gill, went to contest Jazz Quest at Ara. This competition is renowned for its incredibly high standards and gruelling workshops, in which students are pushed to the limits of their musical abilities.

It has been five years since the Papanui Combo last gained the prestigious Gold award. This year "Genevieve and the Jazz Cats" had their work cut out for them, with over 35 groups vying for the top award. 
