Principal's Perspective

On Thursday we held our annual Senior Course Selection evening. I would like to thank the large number of families/ whanau who came to support their child in choosing subjects for next year. This was extremely well attended by the external providers who provided a broad range of post secondary school options for consideration. This gives everyone the opportunity to cross reference subject choices with pre-requisites to further study and/or career pathways. The feedback has been that this is a very valuable night, and that it not only provides a sense of direction, but in many cases supports engagement in school. Simply said; students are studying the right things for the right reasons.

On Friday we held our Senior Academic Conference interview day. For our Year 11 and 12 students, this day plays an integral part in linking the conversations they had on Thursday night, with their planning for 2019, and to support their progress for the remainder of 2018. We also know that our Year 13 students value the opportunity to spend the day focussing and prioritising particular aspects of their school work that they would like to make significant progress on. Throughout the day, the Year 13 students had the opportunity to speak with their Academic Counsellor, cross referencing goals, progress, and next steps as preparation for 2019. A special assembly was held for Year 10 students to support their understanding of NCEA and decision making about subject choices for 2019. The Year 10

going into Year 11, Course Selection evening will be held on the 28th of August, and we look forward to parents and caregivers coming along and discussing this with the teaching staff.

Over the past five years, a large number of dedicated Papanui High School staff and students have been volunteering at the Christchurch City Mission cooking for the Men's Night Shelter. The school's involvement with the Mission was initiated through Ms Judy Coleman, TIC Catering and Hospitality, who has also actively participated in this over the years. Ms Coleman has been on leave this year, and Ms Canny Gaffney (pictured) has taken over the responsibility of this in her absence. Papanui High School is the only school that has reached this milestone (5 years continuous service) which has been recognised with a certificate of appreciation presented at the Christchurch City Mission Volunteers Award Ceremony recently. I am very appreciative of our staff and students for their contribution, and grateful for the service of Ms Gaffney who received this award on the school's behalf.

Bicycle Security at Papanui High School

Unfortunately our school had some incidents of bicycle theft during Term 2. It is timely therefore to remind our community about bicycle security on our campus.

- Bikes should be locked at all times in the designated bike stands
- A good D-Lock is far more secure than a Cable Lock for locking a bike
- It is always a good idea to record bike serial numbers and to take photos of bikes, including any upgrades to parts, in case a bike is unfortunately stolen
- No bikes should be left on our school grounds overnight at all

A message has been put in the student school notices to reinforce to our students the importance of locking bikes.

Changes to Car Parking Outside of the School Gates

There have been some changes to the car parking on Langdons Rd (outside the school gate) that parents/caregivers need to be aware of when dropping off or picking up students from our school.

The Christchurch City Council Traffic Operations team have installed P3 (park 3 minutes) parking restrictions between the hours of 8am to 9am and 2.15pm to 3.15pm directly outside the school gate. These changes have come about due to there being significant concerns regarding the safety of people at the start and end of the school day, when this area of Langdons Road is particularly busy.

We encourage parents/caregivers to use this facility respectfully when dropping off or picking up students. Parking Officers will be enforcing this directive at the times indicated on the signs.

Lateness

Punctuality is an important attribute for our students to develop. Increasing numbers of students are arriving late to class. We would like to remind you of our procedures for when students are late.

All students, if they arrive at school after 8.30am, are to check in at the student office and sign in. If parents/caregivers can excuse the lateness, please contact the school office via phone, email or on the school app - this will mean your child is not issued with a consequence.

Junior students will be issued with what we call a 'U'. This means they will remain after school for 15 minutes with their period 6 teacher.

Senior students will go to detention for 15 minutes at lunchtime on the day of their lateness. If they do not attend, this escalates to 30 minutes at lunchtime the following day.

If again they do not attend, parent/caregivers will be contacted by the Dean or a Senior leader and your child will need to complete a Principal's detention after school for one hour.

Thank you for your support in assisting us with ensuring that students are in class on time ready to learn.

GenConnect: Connecting Generations by Sharing Knowledge

GenConnect: Connecting generations by sharing knowledge

Every Tuesday at Papanui Library, 12.10pm - 12.50pm during the school term

Papanui Library is delighted to announce a programme in conjunction with Papanui High School, called GenConnect. This programme was started at Upper Riccarton Library in 2016, and has proved a huge success, so Papanui Library is keen to offer this service to our local residents.

The idea behind GenConnect is to increase interactions between the younger generations and older adults by providing free technology help. If the programme is successful at Papanui Library, we will offer this as a regular programme during the school terms.

Young people that were born in the age of digital technology are called digital natives, and can navigate most aspects of it with ease, as they have an innate understanding of how it works. But for people who are "digital immigrants" and have to learn how to use it so they can benefit, might find that it takes a bit of practice and perseverance before they feel comfortable using it, because technology is not particularly intuitive.

This is where GenConnect comes in. Technology-oriented intergenerational programmes are a wonderful way to breach the generational gap by providing an opportunity for interaction. Students help older adults feel more comfortable with any digital technology such as smart phone, tablets or laptops, which might be of use to them. On the other hand, adults can contribute by sharing local community history and helping the students learn skills necessary when teaching something, such as empathy, kindness and patience.

Even though Technology is the core of the programme, in reality, it is used as a vehicle to enhance intergenerational relationships and to stimulate learning and dialogue, which may result in better communication, understanding and cooperation.
