Principal's Perspective

This week is Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori (Māori Language Week), which is a government-sponsored initiative promoting the use of Māori language. This gives the school an added opportunity to focus on, and support, the broader Māori language revival and the raising of public awareness of Māori language learning, and public usage.

On Monday I returned to school following my two week overseas marketing trip to Japan, where Mrs Angela Craw, Director of International Students, and I had the pleasure of visiting parents, past and future students, schools, and agents. This trip is very important in reinforcing our connection with Japan as a significant contributor to our school through the international programme. Having the opportunity while we were away, to reflect on how the students were transitioning back into Japanese education was important, in particular how well their English is supporting their further studies and progression into university.

Last Tuesday we held our Year 8 Parent evening. This provided an opportunity for us to welcome our incoming Year 9's for 2019, and their parents/whanau/caregivers. The aim of the evening is to introduce some key people, including the new Year 9 Dean Ms Jane Herman, and to hear about some important information to support their transition into Papanui High School next year. This event was very well attended and we look forward to welcoming our new students with our traditional powhiri next year.

On Thursday night an enthusiastic audience was treated to the 2018 Musical Soiree, who once again has had an outstanding year of achievement. This year's programme included talented performances from the school's Concert and Jazz Bands, Percussion and Flute Ensembles, Saxophone quartet, Rock bands, Theatre-sports team, Choir, and solo acts. At the end of the evening trophies were awarded to the top musicians for 2018.

It is Senior Assessment Week next week, I wish the students well, as this forms part of their preparation for their external exams later in the year.

The Year 9 girls who were part of the Infinite Showcase performed superbly, seamlessly dancing with senior students to enthral the audience. Last week also saw a number of students heading off all around the South Island participating in Tournament week. The feedback received back was exceptionally positive regarding the great fair play shown, and excellent attitude both in success and defeat.

I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate those students who involved themselves in both the Cantamath competition and Speech Competition at school. The quality of the speeches produced by Jude Duven, Campbell Macpherson, and Vivien Silver-Hessey, who were our Year 9 finalists, was exceptionally impressive, and the confidence shown at this early stage in their Secondary School life bodes well for the future. We have also had students participating in the EducationPerfect English and Science Championships. This year we had Lily-Mae Baird who placed in the top 2% of 40,000 competitors around the world for English receiving a Gold Award and in the Science area we had Aimee Pritchard, and Laura Wolland, both receiving a Bronze Award, and Kate Mundy a Gold. This was an outstanding effort for all four students who should be congratulated on this achievement.

By now Year 9 students should have had the opportunity to sample many of our option subjects available. Over the next few weeks they will need to make their option choices for 2019. All students were given an Option Choice booklet during Monday's assembly which gives information about what option choices are available and also a step by step guide on how to enter their choices online. It is very important that they make this choice based on their interests and the successes they have had this year rather than what options their friends are taking. This should be a very considered choice as option changes next year may not be possible due to class sizes and restrictions. All option choices need to be made by the end of term.

Changes to Car Parking Outside of the School Gates

There have been some changes to the car parking on Langdons Rd (outside the school gate) that parents/caregivers need to be aware of when dropping off or picking up students from our school.

The Christchurch City Council Traffic Operations team have installed P3 (park 3 minutes) parking restrictions between the hours of 8am to 9am and 2.15pm to 3.15pm directly outside the school gate. These changes have come about due to there being significant concerns regarding the safety of people at the start and end of the school day, when this area of Langdons Road is particularly busy.

We encourage parents/caregivers to use this facility respectfully when dropping off or picking up students. Parking Officers will be enforcing this directive at the times indicated on the signs.


2019 Board of Trustees Elections

125th Suffrage Celebration

On Thursday 13 September, a group of 18 Papanui High School students along with Mrs Warne and Mr Holland, were given the amazing opportunity to attend the Celebration of the 125th anniversary of Women's Suffrage in New Zealand. The event, held at the Isaac Theatre Royal, featured inspiring speeches from Christchurch Mayor Lianne Dalziel, Honorary Doctor Megan Woods, and keynote speaker, Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern. The celebration reflected greatly on the significance of our nation becoming the first in the world to gain the women's right to vote. The capturing words of the Prime Minister inspired women and men of all ages, encouraging audience members to stay true to themselves, and stand up for what they believe in, especially focussing on gaining real equality, such as pay equity which is a commonly discussed issue in New Zealand, and was well addressed. Our Head Girl Nina Sales, was one of the 19 selected students who asked the Prime Minister a question regarding female leadership. The group left feeling inspired and empowered, having faith that persistence and hard-work could continue propelling New Zealand into equality; making significant impacts in another 125 years.
