Principal's Perspective

This week we had the opportunity to celebrate the senior prize giving, and what a thoroughly enjoyable evening it was. I'd like to thank family, whānau, and friends who came along to share and acknowledge the success of our students. Clearly evident from the evening was the huge range of subject choices that our students can study, and how incredibly talented they are.

In my speech I acknowledged Mrs Yvonne Palmer and presented her a Friends of the School award, which acknowledged her commitment to Papanui High School. For over 20 years Yvonne has been associated with the school through her roles as a Shirley Papanui Community Board chair and member, Projects Manager at Age Concern Canterbury, and Justice of the Peace. Yvonne also contributed to the school benefitting from successful ventures relating to Northlands Mall and the Graham Condon Centre. Throughout this time hundreds of students have benefited personally from fundraising opportunity Yvonne created – this being in excess of \$70,000 going directly to them to support predominately cocurricular activities.

Two other notable achievements were acknowledged. Firstly, the school received an award for reaching the five years continuous service milestone (our school is the only school that has reached this milestone). The certificate of appreciation was presented at the Christchurch City Mission Volunteers Award Ceremony. Over the past five years, a large number of dedicated Papanui High School staff and students have been cooking meals for the Men's Night Shelter.

Secondly, a number of Student Council members had the privilege and exciting opportunity of representing the school for the unveiling of our sponsored room at Ronald McDonald House. The students took part in the ribbon cutting ceremony and room opening for the Teenager Room, which Papanui High School is now the annual sponsor. Currently, we are the only school supporting Ronald McDonald House in this amazing way and it requires the school to raise approximately \$10,000 each year to serve this cause.

I paid tribute to our students. I thanked them for what they have contributed to the year, whether that is in the day-to-day life of the classroom, or through their involvement in co-curricular activities. I also reflected on how wonderfully mature they are, and I appreciated their strong sense of social responsibility. I am very proud of them, and the manner in which they conduct themselves.

Equally important, I acknowledged and thanked our entire staff. Without the absolute commitment of them all, the school cannot succeed to the level it is.
