Top House Activity Day - Friday 7th of December

On Friday 7th of December Year 9 and 10 students will be participating in our annual top house activity day. Throughout the day students will rotate in form classes around 6 activities which include Swiss/volleyball, a general knowledge quiz, an adventure based learning activity, water balloon. Year 10 students will participate in the interactive road safety road show and Year 9 students will visit the Whare to learn Tikanga Māori, and the Haka. This year for the first time students will also be participating in the Sport Canterbury Top Team Challenge. As students will be competing against other classes, but also other houses they are encouraged to wear house coloured clothing on the day. Massey University is conducting a study looking at different types of as**thma in children** aged **14-18yrs**. The aim of the study is to improve our understanding of childhood asthma, which will lead to better asthma treatment options. If you have a **14-18** year old that has asthma, we would be grateful if you consider taking part.

The study initially involves completing a postal questionnaire. On the basis of this questionnaire, we may then ask if your child can visit Christchurch Hospital for a clinical assessment. This will involve a number of tests.

Wellbeing@school Survey

Wellbeing@school survey

During weeks 6 and 7 Year 9 and 10 students will be completing a wellbeing@school survey in their Health and PE classes. Students may have completed a similar survey at their primary or intermediate school. This survey will provide valuable data to the school and the Tōtaranui Kāhui Ako (community of learning) of which Papanui High School is a member.

The Tōtaranui Kāhui Ako is fortunate to be involved in the pilot of the Mana Ake mental health initiative and the longitudinal data that we gather will provide a valuable insight into the wellbeing of the young people in our community.

Mana Ake - Stronger for Tomorrow was established in March 2018 to promote wellbeing and positive mental health for children in school years 1-8 across Canterbury. Data collected from Papanui High School and our Kāhui Ako schools will provide a valuable and comprehensive overview of the wellbeing of our students.

The initiative aims to provide early intervention and support for teachers, families and whānau when children are experiencing ongoing issues that impact their wellbeing. Kaimahi can support individual children and groups of children and provide advice, guidance and support for teachers and parents/whānau. Kaimahi (support workers) are currently working with students in our contributing schools.
