- The nature of the strike is a cessation of work by all PPTA members whose employment falls under the coverage clause of the Secondary Teachers' Collective Agreement 28 October 2015 – 27 October 2018.
- The strike day will be Wednesday 29 May 2019. The schools affected by the strike are all New Zealand state and state integrated secondary schools.

On Wednesday 22nd, the Associate Principal, Mr Vannoort and I, will be attending a conference in Brisbane until Sunday 26th. In my absence Mr Kirby will be Acting Principal.

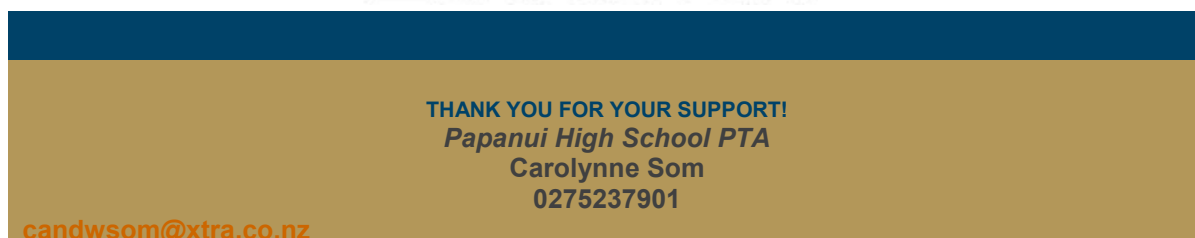
