- The **strike day will be Wednesday 29 May 2019**. The schools affected by the strike are all New Zealand state and state integrated secondary schools.

On Monday 27th May, the Principal Mr Smith and the Associate Principal, Mr Vannoort will be resuming their roles on return from their conference.
