#### Notification of Further PPTA Strike Action.

The PPTA informed on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2019, that they are now giving notice (Pursuant to Section 74AC of the State Sector Act 1988) that teachers who are members of the Post Primary Teachers' Association (PPTA) and who are bound by the Secondary Teachers' Collective Agreement will be on strike in the form of Rostering Home (see below) from Papanui High School, as part of the National Industrial Strike Action which includes all State Secondary Schools, for the below dates.

The nature of this action will be a continuous withdrawal of all labour related to the Year Groups as listed below. This includes work which would otherwise be undertaken on the school site and that which would otherwise be undertaken away from the school site.

(School as usual for all other Year levels on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June).


