Kia Ora,

Tonight (28th June) approximately 480 of our senior students will be enjoying our senior school formal at the University of Canterbury's 'Foundry'. I would like to thank Ms Tanya Sapwell, and Mr Paul Anderson our Year 13 and 12 Deans respectively, as well as the student led Formal organising committee for all of the effort and time they have put in to organising this event.

With only one week to go before the end of term, our students continue to be very busy both in and out of the classroom. This week a large group of Year 12 students have been involved in a Mountain-bike camping experience at Hanmer Springs, next week a group of Year 11 students travel to Dunedin for the 'Brain Bee' Neuroscience Challenge, Year 12 Physics students will make visit to the University of Canterbury, and the Year 12 Leadership group will attend a conference at Christ's College.

During the week we had our last combined assemblies for the term. These assemblies give us an opportunity to celebrate some of the successes our students have achieved, and to pass on important school wide information. SOFIA Flight Opportunity

On Tuesday evening I was given the opportunity to be on board the SOFIA aircraft overnight. SOFIA is a Boeing 747SP aircraft that has been fitted with an infra-red telescope at the rear, with the whole operation being part owned by NASA and DLR (German Space Agency).

This once in a lifetime experience was offered to four Canterbury Science teachers, and I was lucky enough to get selected to take this amazing journey.

The flight departed around 7.30pm Tuesday and landed 5.30am Wednesday. The 10 hours was spent observing what the scientists on board were doing, talking with the various crew, and gathering insight with the intention of sparking students interest in Astronomy and Physics. Along with all that I got to see an aurora, learnt some new Science, and even was allowed to be in the cockpit for landing.

I had to pinch myself a few times as we climbed above 40, 000 ft in the air, crossing below the 60th parallel and getting to play around with the monitoring screens in-front of us. The crew were very accommodating, and made the whole experience a very enjoyable one. I'd highly recommend that if anyone gets a chance to go on SOFIA, even on the ground, to do so.
