Kia Ora,

This week the Papanui High School Jazz Band and the Papanui High School Jazz Combo are once again competing at the Southern Jam in Blenheim with over 20 other bands from around New Zealand. This trip sees the best Jazz and Contemporary musicians perform at a very high level. Both groups are out to defend their medal placings from last year. Last week the students warmed up for this event by competing in the annual Jazz Quest competition which showcases some of the country's top secondary school jazz bands and musicians. At the competition, the Papanui High School Big Band won Gold, and Genevieve and the Jazz Cats won Silver. We wish them all the very best this weekend.

Next Thursday the 15th August, is our Senior Course selection evening. We would encourage all parents, caregivers, and whānau to attend this evening with their child. ### Senior Academic Counselling Interview Day - Friday 16th August

On Friday 16th August we are holding our second AC interview day for senior students. All students in Years 11-13 will spend the day in their form rooms, studying independently, whilst Academic Counsellors complete AC interviews and assist with senior course selection for 2020.

The day is an excellent opportunity for students to complete work set by subject teachers to reinforce the current learning occurring in all NCEA subjects.

To make the most of the day, it is crucial students spend the week leading up to the day ensuring they understand the work set and ensuring they have the necessary resources to complete the work. For many students, the use a fully charged electronic device on Friday, would be most helpful.

Our junior students will be given a revised timetable for the day and will continue with their usual subjects and teachers wherever possible.

### Year 10

It is hard to believe that the first half of the year has been and gone, and Term 3 is shaping up to be one of the busiest terms in the school year at Papanui High School. At the end of last term you received your child's midyear report, which gave an in-depth indication of how your child is progressing throughout all curriculum areas, and whether there were any issues for concern. It was wonderful to see so many of you attend the Parent Teacher interviews to discuss face to face your child's achievements, and look at potential areas for improvement. It is at this part of the year, that it is time to imbed those changes necessary to create good habits with NCEA looming in the not too distant future.

Getting as much exposure to our different subject options is particularly important, as over the upcoming weeks we will be focusing on option choices for 2020. Please remember if you have any further questions as a result of attending this evening, do not hesitate to contact the teacher in charge of the subject area concerned as we realise how important it is for our students to make informed decisions.

Recently we have tried to rid some students of the belief that barely doing enough to scrape through is okay, as we want to encourage them to try and strive to reach their full potential. Although it is hard work, we should be aiming for excellence, not only in our academic and sporting pursuits, but also in terms of our behaviour, and the way we present ourselves in terms of uniform. A good way to check to see if your child is making the most of the learning opportunities given to them, is to continue to have conversations around the fortnightly progress report, where three's indicate engagement in learning in class, and completion of set tasks.
