At the end of this year eighteen Year 12 students and two staff will be embarking on a service trip to Cambodia. This trip was conceived by eager students during their second year at Papanui (2017). They wanted to expand on goals they created whilst attending a leadership course run by the Student Volunteer Army at the University of Canterbury. From there they approached organisations that run these excursions and were very impressed by Pacific Discovery, the only one that was owned and operated in New Zealand.

Ten out of the seventeen days is service focused, meaning students will find themselves doing anything from conversing in English at a local high school, helping build a simple home for a family in need, dance classes with the physically disabled, music lessons with children, and learning about local Cambodian social enterprises.



Papanui High believes this trip will help the students mature and grow in ways unknown to them at this stage and provide an opportunity of a lifetime they'll never forget. It will allow them to extend their leadership skills and develop new ones. Further to this, being in a foreign country will allow the students to work on communication skills and it will benefit both the students and the communities they will be involved in.
