Queensland Touch Tournament

The Senior Boys' and Senior Girls' Touch teams, plus two student referees, embarked on a trip to Australia from the 6th -14th October. The purpose of the trip was to participate in the Queensland All Schools Touch Tournament in Brisbane. This is one of the largest Touch tournaments in the world, consisting of over 215 schools, 445 teams, and over 6000 players in the Under 13, Under 15, and Under 18 grades. For the days preceding the tournament the teams trained in 30+ degree heat, shopped, and visited tourist destinations including Dreamworld, and Surfers Paradise. The players were excited to start the tournament despite the thunder, lightning, and downpours. The boys competed well in their pool, coming away with three wins, and scoring some impressive tries. The girls improved throughout the tournament, and thoroughly enjoyed the experience of playing Queensland and Singaporean school teams.

Both teams would like to thank parents for their support and help with fundraising, Miss McConnel for the organisation, Miss Rutherford and Mr Smith for their impressive player management and physiotherapy work, and Mr Peawini and Miss Carson for the time given to coaching the teams.
