

NZ Ultimate Frisbee Team

Gabrielle Foster (Year 12) has been selected in the NZ Ultimate Frisbee Under 20 National Training Squad, which works towards the Asia-Oceanic Junior Ultimate Champs in Manila Philippines in early December, and ultimately the World Junior Ultimate Champs which will be held in July 2020 in Malmo, Sweden.

This squad consists of about 40 under 20 female players from around New Zealand and from this, 18 are selected to attend each championship. So far Gabrielle has been selected as part of the team to compete at the Asia-Oceanic Junior Ultimate Champs in Philippines in early December.

Over Labour Weekend, Gabrielle was part of a NZ team that participated in the Division 1 Australian Mixed Ultimate Champs, competing against Australia's top teams. There were 15 teams from Australia and one team from New Zealand which qualified as part of State Champs and Division 1 NZ Champs. The NZ team came 6th out of the 16 teams, moving up three placings from last year. They played 10 games of length 80 - 110 minutes each over the weekend, with 5 wins and 5 losses and 4 games to Universe point. Solid effort from everyone on the team with much to bring home to NZ!
