Activities Day - Friday 6th of December

Next Friday Year 9 and 10 students will be participating in our annual activities day. The day will start with form time at 8.30am, then for the remainder of the day, students will rotate in form classes around six activities which include Swiss/volleyball, a general knowledge quiz, tabloids, multisport, and water balloon drop. Year 10 students will spend a short amount of time off site at the Papanui Youth Centre which is run by Papanui Youth Development Trust and Year 9 students will visit the Whare to learn Tikanga Māori, and the Haka. Students are asked to wear active wear for the day, and are reminded that it is important for health and safety that they wear appropriate sports shoes for practical activities.

There is no cost for the day, but a number of food items will be available for sale at lunchtime including a sausage sizzle, Mr Whippy, and Candyfloss.

Digital Citizenship

What challenges do young people face online?

We all need to understand online risks and support our young people to have better online experiences. There may be a gap between what you and your children know of the online world, but you don't need to be a tech expert. The basic rules of right and wrong apply online just as they do offline. So what are the main challenges that young people face online?

- Online bullying one in five young people is the recipient of online bullying in NZ every year.
- Unwanted contact as children grow they will connect with more people they don't know and this can lead to children being groomed or talking to someone who isn't who they say they are.
- Social media social media can present a number of challenges for young people around content, connections, and privacy.
- Sexting describes sending and receiving nude content, including naked pictures and sexual text messages.
- Inappropriate content this can be illegal or offensive content and young people can be exposed to it without searching for it.

Netsafe have put together a great Online Safety Parent's Toolkit which you can find here. It provides a range of ideas to "enhance your digital parenting knowledge and reinforce key elements of online safety." Here are three things you can do right away:

- Learn Ask your child about what they do, how they use devices and who they talk to. Learn about their activities. Check in regularly to see what has changed.
- 2. Agree - Create a family code with your child to agree on what they can do online including sites to visit, appropriate behaviours, privacy settings and limits
- 3. Plan - Make a plan so everybody knows what to do if something goes wrong and where you will be able to get advice and support in challenging times (see last week's Papanews!)


Thank you to all of our Papanui High School community who got behind this wonderful event that supports Ronald McDonald House, especially our hard working Year 9 and 10 students.


Art Students Shortlisted


