Digital Citizenship

Understanding Tiktok

TikTok is a platform for creating, sharing and discovering short videos. It seems to be the hottest app with young people right now and has recently surpassed over 1 billion installs on the App Store and Google Play. A lot of the content is really funny and very creative - the first way to find out more about TikTok would be to sit down and get your teen to show you some of their favourite videos!

TikTok does seem to have some good online safety features. Users can block people they don't want contact from and report inappropriate content or contact. It has a Safety Centre that is worth exploring either with your child or on your own. TikTok also has dedicated resources for parents that you might want to read. It explains how to set up restricted mode or establish screen time limits - possibly important given the addictive nature of this app.

So what are the online safety challenges related to TikTok? Some of the most common concerns are that users can see inappropriate content or be contacted by people they don't know. While there does not seem to be a problem with pornographic content on Tik Tok, young people will be exposed to a lot of foul language, either from the 'musers' (name for Tik Tok users) themselves or the songs they use in their videos.

This is a risk of predators approaching children on TikTok. To manage this, ensure that your child's account is set to 'Private'. You can also toggle off 'Allow others to find me' which will stop strangers seeing your child's account show up in search results. Finally, by changing all safety settings to 'Friends', your child will not be able to invite strangers into their account either.

One other thing: TikTok collects a ton of personal data about its users so it is also a good idea to opt out of data collection (done in the app's settings).

Take the time to learn about what your child is doing online and teach them the online safety basics before they start using social media. Netsafe's Parent Toolkit is super-helpful.
