# **Engagement Reports**

Engagement Reports will resume next week (Wednesday 17 February) for Year 9 and 10 students. Parents/ Caregivers will receive an email showing the level of their child's 'engagement' to their learning for each of their classes, measured through a grade out of '3' for each subject. An explanation of the grades and the criteria for awarding them will be included in the email. Senior students will receive their first engagement reports the following week on Wednesday 24 February. Following this, engagement reports will be sent home every Wednesday, alternating between junior and senior reports.

The focus of these fortnightly engagement reports is primarily twofold:

- 1. to provide parents with regular and on-going information about their child's engagement in their learning, and
- 2. to provide students and parents a clear picture of the degree to which a student is putting themselves in the best possible position to progress their learning in the future.

If you have questions or concerns as to why a particular grade was given to your child, please feel free to contact the subject teacher directly via email.

The school will continue to review how best to use the data collected from these engagement reports, to ensure individual students are supported both pastorally and academically.

# Subject Teacher - Meet & Greet - Year 10-13

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> February, we are holding a "Meet & Greet" evening for parents/whānau, students and subject teachers of our Year 10-13 cohorts. The purpose of this evening is to strengthen connections between home and school by ensuring parents/caregivers know how to and feel confident in making contact with subject teachers. It also gives us an opportunity to explain the teaching and learning programme planned for the year, and the assessment opportunities available.

#### Cando cards

Cando cards are produced by Ecardz on behalf of Metro Buses. The card acts as a student identification (providing proof of age/identity) and metro card but also allows students to access a number of exclusive discounts at retailers and services in the Canterbury area. In 2021 the card can also be registered for contact tracing.

Cando cards will be available to purchase by ALL students for a cost of \$10 on Friday 19th (in the school hall foyer, during photos, interval or lunch). Year 9 students will also be given the opportunity to purchase their cards via a provided envelope during next week.



On the day students must pay the \$10 (correct change needed) at the time of their class and individual photo using the photo ID card they will be given on the day. Year 9 photos will be supplied by Photolife so will not need to be taken on the day.
