# **Australasian Ethics Olympiad - GOLD!**

After an exhausting day on Thursday, competing on Zoom from 1.00pm - 5.30pm, Congratulations to the following Year 10 students: Josh Rae, Shelby Allen, Chloe Morrison Clarke, and Indie Lewis, who won Gold at the Australasian Ethics Olympiad.

The Ethics Olympiad provides schools with a unique opportunity to develop skills in critical thinking, collaboration and communication. The students (Eth-letes) are trained by a coach (usually a teacher at the school) in order to prepare for an Olympiad. Ethical Cases are provided to participating schools well before the event.

An Ethics Olympiad is a competitive yet collaborative event in which students analyse and discuss real-life, and timely, ethical issues. It differs from a debate in that students are not assigned opposing views rather, they defend whatever position they believe is right and win by showing that they have thought more carefully, deeply, and perceptively about the cases in question. The event encourages and promotes ethical awareness, critical thinking skills, civil discourse, international engagement, and an appreciation for diverse points of view.

They all worked extremely hard preparing for this gruelling intellectual challenge.

# Digital Citizenship: Protecting young peoples' privacy online

#### Digital Citizenship: Protecting young people's privacy online

Discussing privacy issues with young people is really important. Recent research from the Data & Security Institute shows that teenagers are crying out for more adult guidance when it comes to managing their privacy online. Here are some conversation starters you can have with your children:

- What are your privacy settings on Snapchat/Instagram etc.? Instagram, by default, is set to Public. People
  need to go to Settings and turn on 'Posts are Private'. Pictures are then no longer accessible and users will
  need to get your child's permission to follow them. Snapchat's default settings mean that only friends can view
  snaps or stories. Tell them it is okay to limit who can see your info and what you share.
- What are your guidelines for sharing things online? Remind them to share with care. When they put things
  online, they may be sharing information another person doesn't want to be out there e.g. their likeness, their
  personal information like school, address, hobbies etc. They should ask permission before they share a photo
  of someone or tag someone in a photo. And they should take it down if they are asked.
- Do you ever log in on someone else's phone or give your login information to anyone else? Young people
  have been known to do this, particularly to maintain 'streaks' on Snapchat (where messaging a friend at least
  once a day for three days in a row creates a 'streak'). Help them understand that this is a very risky thing to
  do. If their friend's device is compromised, it leaves their accounts vulnerable to hacking and the loss or abuse
  of any photos or data associated with that account.
