Kia ora,

We have just completed Week 6, which is just over half way through the first term, and staff and students will be well and truly settled into the routine of teaching and learning.

We thank them for their ongoing commitment to this event. As we all know food can be a wonderful barrier breaker, and often serves as a positive introduction to gaining some knowledge around a country's culture. Many staff and students thoroughly appreciated having the opportunity to be treated to a fabulous selection of food.
