Kia ora,

On Tuesday evening we held our Senior Parent Teacher night, and I would like to thank the large number of whānau/caregivers who were able to attend. We hope you found this evening supportive as part of our on-going attempts to provide information and an ongoing opportunity to gain a greater understanding of the progress your child is making by talking with their subject teachers.

On Thursday the school participated in the second PPTA Accord Day. I would like to thank our community for their understanding, as the school needed to be closed for tuition to allow our staff to engage in the very important Professional Development linked to the future changes for NCEA. There are two further Accord Days scheduled for 2021, one day each in August, and November.
