Year 12 Emerging Leaders Conference

Eleven Papanui High School Year 12 students joined about 450 other students from 28 schools across Canterbury to learn about leadership from a range of inspiring speakers at a one-day leadership conference on Tuesday at Christ's College. The theme was "Courage is the key to great leadership" following the Covid-19-enforced cancellation of the popular Emerging Leaders event last year.

In his keynote speech, entrepreneur and inventor Logan Williams, urged students to "be courageous" and not get "stuck down a career path". "To think outside the box and do something different, you have to be courageous," he told the students. "Life is full of opportunities; you just have to take them."

Students also took part in a range of workshops, including a session on different ways of looking at leadership – presented by University of Canterbury Associate Professor Billy Osteen; leadership in stressful situations – led by emergency medicine specialist Dr Minette Monteith; and leadership in overcoming adversity – presented by Dan Sharples, who "reclaimed" his life after fighting cancer.

Other workshops included self-leadership, positive wellbeing, creative leadership, servant leadership and functional leadership.

Blackcap Todd Astle wrapped up the day with an inspiring presentation about the courageous actions required to navigate the twists and turns of life.
