Ministry of Education Initiative - Free Period Products

Periods are a fact of life for half the population. Despite this, young people don't always have access to the products they need to feel comfortable at school, engage in their learning, and manage what should be a normal and healthy part of life.

Poor access to period products can affect students' attendance and engagement at school. Students also miss out on sporting and cultural activities and can feel embarrassed and ashamed about not being supported to manage their periods. This affects their achievement and wellbeing.

Access to period products is a necessity, not a luxury. The need to access period products exists for every young person who experiences menstruation including young women, girls, transgender, and gender diverse youth, in ways that meet diverse needs and cultural perspectives. Therefore a selection of period products will now be available to our female and gender diverse students for free.

Providing access to free period products to those who need it in all kura will:

- reduce barriers to access and improve school attendance, sports involvement and tertiary participation
- improve child and youth wellbeing
- reduce financial strain on families and whānau experiencing poverty/material hardship, and
- promote positive gender norms and reduce stigmatisation of menstruation.

From Term 3 (date to be confirmed) period products will be available for students to collect once a fortnight during form time. Students will be allocated approx 2 x packets (of tampons, sanitary pads or a combination of) per month, with two sizes of each variety being available.

Emergency supplies will be available at the following places:

- **Female toilets;** J, F, R and P blocks, and the Gym.
- Most unisex toilets including; Wharekai, Student Support, and Sick bay
- Staff offices; Deans, HPE, Languages/ESOL, and Food Technology
- Other venues; Aiga formroom, Student Support, the Withdrawal room, and Student Office

Brain Bee

This week four Year 11 students headed to Dunedin for the annual Brain Bee Neuroscience competition. The competition provides an opportunity to spend time at Otago University and Museum where students experience life as a Health Science student, participating in an electrostimulation lab, hearing a lecture on brain plasticity, learning how electron microscopy works and visiting the Anatomy Museum with students from all over Te Wai Pounamu - the South Island. The highlight for many was sleeping at the museum where activities for after-hours were planned - a scavenger hunt in the galleries, a dark walk through the Animal Attic and the Olympic Odyssey. Red Weekend - RockQuest Success

The Smoke Free Rock Quest competition is an annual rite of passage for aspiring young rock bands from throughout Aotearoa/New Zealand. This year we have witnessed an outstanding result with Papanui High School's Red Weekend and Motion Project both making it to the Regional heats. Red Weekend then went on to win the People's Choice Award and selection to submit for inclusion in the National Finals in Auckland in September.

This is a rare achievement and a testament to the hard work and dedication of these young men. The process to submit to the Nationals includes writing new original material, rehearsing, performing and filming it, all within a very short space of time. The submitted film is then viewed, alongside entries from across the country. A nail biting period of waiting is then endured.



Red Weekend began this musical odyssey as one of hundreds of aspiring bands across the country. Hundreds of entries in Christchurch alone, Red Weekend are now one of 14 groups invited to apply to the finals. Bands are chosen from throughout the country making up a total of 30 finalists, from which 10 are selected to perform in the National Finals. This feat alone is greater than anything previously achieved by a PHS Band - So congratulations to Caleb Barlow, Sam Hicks, Jaxon Faithful, Daniel Ralph and Cam Williams for making it to the top 30 Bands in NZ in 2021, and we wish them all the best in the final stages of the selection process.
