Principal's Perspective

Kia ora,

The term has begun with relatively normal 'busyness' and expectations, which in many ways is reassuring. Being able to build back into the broader aspects of school life is important, and we look forward to continuing this process throughout the term. Reflecting this change, a number of EOTC activities took place including the Year 12 Outdoor Education classes participating in first-aid courses, a group of students successfully competed in the Christchurch Secondary Schools' Road Race, the Year 13 Biology students had a field trip to Orana Park, and the Pasifika students' Leadership group travelled to a Leadership Camp at Hanmer Springs.

This week it has been nice to have a school wide focus on something other than Covid. On Thursday our school, along with all Christchurch secondary schools, participated in the first PPTA Accord Day for 2022. I would like to thank our community for their understand as the school needed to be closed for tuition to allow our staff to engage in the Professional Development linked to the future changes for NCEA. There are 4 Accord Days allocated this year to support the implementation of changes to NCEA. There will be another one in Term 3 on the 22nd of August, and two more yet to be confirmed to be held in Term 4.

We're heading into another full and busy week next week which includes such things as: Otago University and Ara drop in sessions, Year 12 first aid, a Year 13 Geography field trip, winter sport starting, the Ethics Olympiad, and Bullying-Free week (with the theme this year 'He kōtuinga mahi iti, he hua pai-ā rau'; small ripples create big waves) finishing with a Pink Shirt Day on Friday, and the Relay for Life on Saturday here at school from 9.00am until 5.00pm (please come down to support the school in this important fundraiser).

The Sport and Health Council run a number of staff vs students competitions each term. On Wednesday lunchtime it was a tug of war. Six students from each year level went head-to-head to find the strongest group of students to then face off against the staff team. This year, the staff won.

As we continue to keep all of the required health measures in place at school, you may be interested to know that we are currently averaging approximately 30 students per week with Covid. School Uniform Update

School uniform promotes school identity as well as pride and minimises the social pressures of overdressing in a school environment. Wearing our uniform correctly is important for our school tone because it shifts the emphasis from competition back to academic performance, personal achievement and mutual respect. This is reflected in our school's PRIDE values.

Unfortunately, we have seen a small shift from some students towards the wearing of incorrect uniform items as winter approaches, and we are asking caregivers to help us address this.

Information regarding our school uniform is available on the school <u>website</u>. We have a range of jerseys, cardigans and waterproof or softshell jackets available for purchase, and can provide these items for any student that is not able to source their own.

We have also seen this term that there are a small number of students wearing cargo shorts or trousers or black shorts, ie faitaga and trousers. These are not part of the regulation school uniform.

Regulation items can be purchased from <u>Mainland Uniforms</u>, online via <u>Withers and Co</u> or from the uniform section of The Warehouse Northlands. Items such as shorts and trousers need to be purchased from the suppliers above or the second-hand uniform store.

Uniform passes

If a student is unable to wear the correct uniform they can get a uniform pass from the Deans area. The student will need a note from home outlining the issue with the uniform, and a timeline for the issue to be rectified. Passes are provided before school and during form times and intervals.

Passes are issued for three lengths of time;

- Long term: for students who have a reason to wear a mutually agreeable alternative to the school uniform.
- Up to 5 days: for students that need the weekend to source a replacement item.
- 1 day: for students that have a wet or lost item that will be wearable the next day.

Please note: starting Week 2 of Term 2 students who are in incorrect uniform without a uniform pass will be expected to attend lunchtime detention which will operate in the same way as our late system.
