



### Principal's Perspective

Kia ora,

As we come to the end of Week 4 we have noted some increases in both staff and student absence due to sickness and Covid alongside our continued effort to run curriculum based trips. On Thursday this was particularly difficult, and some classes were 'joined together' to support the teaching and learning process. It is important that we continue to try and manage on-site learning using a range of strategies. On Friday we were able to cover all staff absences with relieving teachers. At the moment this is a bit of a challenging space, our priority is to try and keep all our students at school every day of the week, however if this trend continues or worsens then there is a possibility that rostering home may be required. If this were to be the case we would inform our community in a timely manner.

In line with looking to increase our involvement in the wider range of school related activities as mentioned last week, we had a very large group of enthusiastic students, staff, and community supporters participating in the Cancer Society Relay For Life on Saturday. The team spent all day walking and running around the 400m track, and completed a total of 2462 laps which totals to 984.8km! We are very grateful to our sponsors and to the generosity of the school community. Our school team has raised a current total of over \$12,000 to go towards the Cancer Society. ## 529 Garage

### Help protect your family's bikes from theft

Bike theft is on the rise in Christchurch with an average of 4 bikes reported stolen to Police every day. There's a new tool available to help combat bike theft, called 529 Garage which helps Police return stolen bikes and e-scooters to their rightful owners.

529 Garage is a quick, free and easy-to-use portal that enables you to register your family's bikes, with photos, descriptions and serial numbers.

Once registered, you can obtain a 529 Garage shield for your bike, which is tamper-resistant and acts as a warning sign to thieves to back off because the bike is registered and Police will have no trouble identifying it's stolen. Shields are free for a limited time and can be posted straight to your door.

If your bike gets stolen, you can use 529 Garage to send an alert to the local 529 community, and have all the details on hand to report the theft to the Police. If someone sees your bike, they can contact you anonymously through the app, or you can choose to display your contact information.
