### **Principal's Perspective**

Kia ora,

I am hopeful that the extended long weekend provided students with a well-timed break, and an opportunity to recharge as we move into the second half of this term.

I would like to thank Mrs Kerren Langdon, and Ms Jane Herman, our Year 13 and 12 Deans respectively, as well as the 20 member student-lead Formal Organising Committee for all of their effort and time they have put into organizing this event.

We have a busy week coming up. Our Diversity Council are running PRIDE week, where we acknowledge and celebrate with our rainbow community. Monday signals the start of Semester 2 for our senior students, where many of them will begin new courses for the second half of their academic year. We wish them well during this transition and encourage them to continue to achieve their personal best in all that they do, both in the classroom and beyond. #### MOE BUILDING UPDATE

Late last year the school had signposted that the new buildings set for redevelopment were to begin at the start of 2022. The first stage of demolition has taken place, as has the relocation of the F Block prefabs to the fields. Unfortunately, further progress has been delayed. We can all appreciate the challenges with Covid, and escalation of building costs, however, the school has voiced its frustrations in relation to the lack of progress to the Ministry of Education, seeking clarification of process. The Board of Trustees has received a response from the Ministry of Education which they have written to be shared with our community. This letter can be found on the following page.

#### **Redevelopment Project**

The Ministry of Education would like to acknowledge a recent letter received from the Papanui High School Board of Trustees seeking clarification in relation to the school's postearthquake construction programme.

The Ministry of Education acknowledges the importance for the school to have accurate information regarding the progress of their projects, and we recognise and understand the frustration that has been felt by the school and its board regarding changes to its redevelopment.

The Ministry of Education works hard to minimise delays to projects, and acknowledges that unfortunately, for Papanui High School, further delays have eventuated. Originally, your scheduled redevelopment work was set to start in December, and we now expect construction to commence in June.

It is now likely that the redevelopment will be carried out in multiple stages, which usually takes longer than projects which are built in a single stage. We understand that the Papanui High School Community will be disappointed by this news.

The current plan for the phased redevelopment now includes:

Phase 1 of works:

a site wide upgrade to existing infrastructure, a new 20TS block (West Block), an upgrade to existing ablution blocks

Phase 2 will include:

a new 13TS block (East Block) and upgrades to the Administration Block

Where necessary, maintenance that has been deferred will be addressed in theses initial phases. The rebuild of the existing library is not in this current scope of work and will happen in phase three. MINISTRY OF EDUCATION TE TAHUHU O TE MATAURANGA


## **Jolt Fundraiser**

# 529 Garage

### Help protect your family's bikes from theft

Bike theft is on the rise in Christchurch with an average of 4 bikes reported stolen to Police every day. There's a new tool available to help combat bike theft, called 529 Garage which helps Police return stolen bikes and e-scooters to their rightful owners.

529 Garage is a quick, free and easy-to-use portal that enables you to register your family's bikes, with photos, descriptions and serial numbers.

Once registered, you can obtain a 529 Garage shield for your bike, which is tamper-resistant and acts as a warning sign to thieves to back off because the bike is registered and Police will have no trouble identifying it's stolen. Shields are free for a limited time and can be posted straight to your door.

If your bike gets stolen, you can use 529 Garage to send an alert to the local 529 community, and have all the details on hand to report the theft to the Police. If someone sees your bike, they can contact you anonymously through the app, or you can choose to display your contact information.

Own transport will be required for this event and the cost is \$30 per person.


### Marching Canterbury.

Marching encourages teamwork, discipline, and friendship. It's great for coordination, posture and brain development. We have teams in all areas of Christchurch.


