I would like to start by acknowledging and congratulating the students who attended the senior formal last Friday night at the University of Canterbury Students' Association. Smokefree Rockquest and Tangata Beats

Smokefree Rockquest and Tangata Beats were held last weekend in Ōtautahi.

This year Papanui High school had students in three Papanui bands, and three other students in other combined schools' bands.

"The Kava Kings" made up of Year 11, 12, and 13 Pasifika students entered Tangata Beats, and this was the first public performance for this group. They wrote and performed a beautiful gospel song and wowed the 200 strong crowd with some beautiful harmonies. This band has been mentored by Tusi Elisara and Seta Timo and we are very grateful for their input.

"Hot Feet" is a band of Year 12's that entered both Tangata Beats and Rockquest, and their original song featured Te Reo. Their song was a very well crafted, socially conscious song, and their confident and uplifting performance resulted in this band making it to the next round of the Regional finals, which is a great achievement considering the competition featured entries from around 80 bands, and only a small group were selected to go through the next stage.

The third band "Beyond London" are a group of Year 11's and they have a great song ready to be submitted as an online entry due to sickness.

This is the first time Papanui High school has had entries for Tangata Beats for many years, and considering the short amount of time to write and rehearse the songs due the challenges of this year it was a great achievement by all.

We are very proud of the students for creating the precious taonga of their original thoughts and feelings packaged into 3 beautiful songs.


Marching Canterbury.
