I would like to sincerely thank the large number of parents, whānau, and caregivers who were able to come along to the Senior Course Selection evening on Thursday. The evening was very well attended by both our community, and the tertiary providers and training organisations, who provided a broad range of post secondary school options for consideration. Following on from this, next week our Year 11 and 12 students will have an opportunity to cross reference subject choices to potentially align with further study and/or career pathways. The feedback has been that this was a very valuable night, and that it not only provides a sense of direction, and motivation to be aspirational around their future. Simply said; students are studying the right things for the right reasons.

Last Thursday evening we welcomed two new members to join our Board of Trustees Allison Arrow and Husein Bahrainwala We thank them in advance for putting themselves forward to support the ongoing governance of our school, and we look forward to working with them on behalf of our school community.

A reminder that Monday 22nd August is an Accord Day (a staff only day) and the school will not be open for instruction. The day offers all Christchurch secondary school teachers the day to continue the process of developing an understanding of the NCEA curriculum changes which are due to be implemented in 2024. There will be two further days to be scheduled later in Term 4.

Jazz News

The Jazz band and Funk band have been extremely busy lately performing around Christchurch to the delight of fans and caregivers!

On the 31st of July they took part in the annual Jazz Quest at Ara. This has been the first time an audience has been able to watch this event for a few years and it was an exciting time for tutors and caregivers as they watched the students perform and make Papanui proud. The Jazz Band received a Silver award for Jazz Quest for their performances of songs that the judges commented were "a great mix of genres and challenging arrangements".

The Funk band received a Bronze award with some comments like "great to see the vibraphone up there". This of course was Hannah Kagawa who has recently made the New Zealand Secondary Schools' Orchestra on percussion and has turned her skills to Funk Jazz to the delight of surprised Jazz tutors. Other comments from the judges were "a good vibe to this group" and "you were having fun".

The following week New Zealand Big Band legend Rodger Fox, came to Papanui High to take the Jazz band and to provide some feedback for the upcoming Otautahi Jazz Spectacular which was put on this year as replacement for the Southern Jam Jazz Festival that was unfortunately cancelled.

It was amazing to see Rodger Fox, and he had some very positive things to say about the band, in particular the rhythm section featuring Cadence Zhou and NicoTudor-Oakley. The Jazz band thoroughly enjoyed having some expert feed-back and the next gig they did on the following Saturday certainly was a step up from Jazz Quest as they put Rodger's' advice into action.

That gig was on Saturday the 6th August at Christchurch Boys' High as part of the Ōtautahi Jazz Spectacular. The Jazz band and the Funk Band, now named "The Kids from Planet Funkatron" performed with all the other top bands in Christchurch.

The standard was very high and our two bands really had to be at the top of their game - and they were! The performances

that night were of a very high standard, and the audience was treated to a whole night of amazing music. Alisha Hitchens shined that night on vocals with a beautiful rendition of "It had better be tonight" that ended with a glorious long note that wowed the audience.

Still not done with the performing yet, The Kids from Planet Funkatron then finished the treble with a set at Loop Youth Centre for Band night. Led by Quillan Dextar who is not only the lead Saxophonist, but also the band leader, the 9 band members somehow squeezed onto the tiny stage at the Youth Centre and performed to a rapturous audience.

Quillan has just found out the exciting news, that after a grueling audition process he has made the Christchurch Youth Jazz Orchestra, a band which is made up of the best young performers in Ōtautahi. This is a massive achievement as the standard throughout the last concert and audition standard has been so high, and only 4 - 6 saxophonists are chosen. After a band camp he will perform as part of the opening gala performance at The Piano, and as part of the Christchurch Big Band Festival picnic.

A massive thanks to Georgina Rees Stevenson who has been taking the Jazz band and has been putting in so much extra work to get them to the amazing level they are now at.

I'm sure you are all looking forward to seeing the Jazz and Funk flow at the upcoming Papanui Soirée later this term.





Culinary Challenge Success

This year the senior Year 13 Chef classes were able to enter the New Zealand National Secondary School Culinary Challenge (**NSSCC**). It was completed online, but took 7 weeks of class time to complete.

This year's 'Hero' vegetable was beetroot which meant that the beetroot was the main ingredients in two entree dishes. The students were also able to gain 10 Level 3 NCEA credits. Which was a new thing and meant that at least the students gained recognition for all their Hard work.

The Papanui teams made:

curry with kaffir lime tempeh, waffles with a vegan aioli, beetroot risotto, beetroot and carrot fritters, beetroot tarte tatin, and parsnip, beetroot au gratin. and a trio of beetroot-based dips with homemade crackers.

Well done to the students as The Papanui teams won 4 Silvers and 3 bronze awards -silver (89-80) or bronze medal (79-70)
