Senior Assessment Week - Week 9

Senior Assessment week will take place in week 9 over 5 days - 19-23 September. Some assessments count towards a final grade for qualifications while others are practices for the end-of-year national examinations. The results from these practice examinations may be used as evidence in the emergency grades process for NZQA.


Important Information
