Billie Nuku - Netball

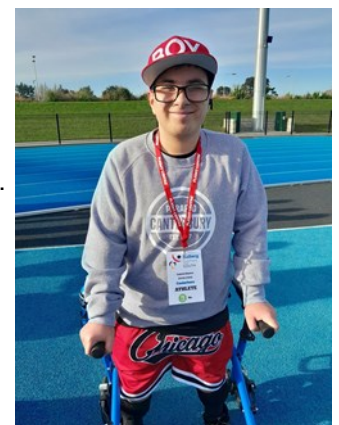
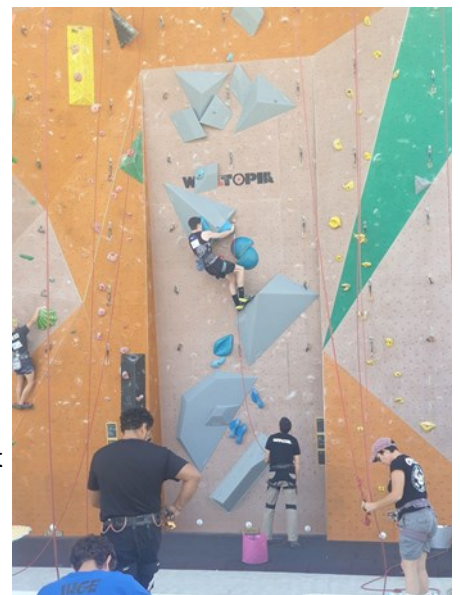
Congratulations to Billie Nuku who has been picked to be in a Tactix/Mainland Netball ID training camp this weekend.

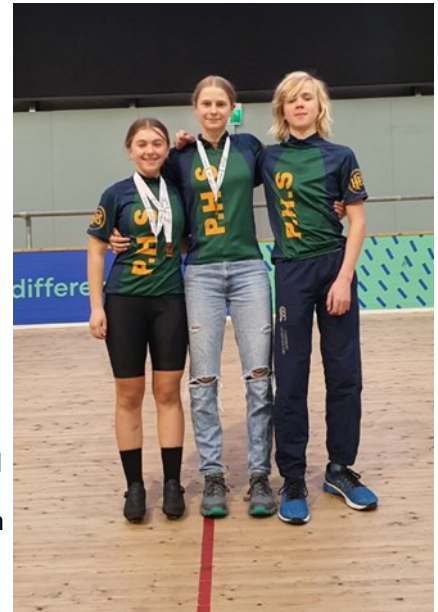


Kirsty Watts - Cycling
