# **Principal's Perspective**

Kia ora.

This week saw the start of the NCEA exams for our senior students, I hope they are progressing well for them. Equally, it is important for our junior school to maintain a strong focus on engagement to support their learning for the remaining five weeks of the school year. During this time, conversations will take place through various forums to help set the scene for the transition of Year 9 to Year 10, and Year 10 into an NCEA focussed Year 11. It is also nice for our junior students to have the school to themselves for a little while.

On Wednesday afternoon the Tōtaranui Kāhui Ako held its annual cultural festival at Casebrook Intermediate. The afternoon consisted of performances from all of the Kāhui Ako schools; Te Kura Mareko Casebrook Intermediate, Te Kura Papakōhatu Bishopdale School, Te Kura o Matarangi Northcote School, Cotswold Mātāhae School, Papanui School, Te Kura o te Rakau Whero Redwood School and our school, Papanui High School. Papanui High School Work Day: 25th OR 28th of November

This work day is for all Year 9 and 10 students to raise funds to support Ronald McDonald House. This is an incredibly important organization that supports unwell children and their families. Our school sponsors the Teenager Room in their Cashel Street building. This is our marquee sponsorship for the community. We aim to raise at least \$10,000 for this cause this year. Our students will be receiving information about this activity early next week.



Work need not be completed on Work Day as students may choose to do this on another day (e.g. a weekend). However, on Friday the 25th of November and Monday the 28th of November, Papanui High School has two Staff Only Days (Accord Days). These days provide an obvious opportunity to complete work.

The target is for each student to raise a minimum donation of **\$10 total** for the equivalent of one and a half hours work. Our school anticipates that a large number of students will find work at home, with friends, with relatives, or neighbours.

The Work Day gives students the opportunity to work in their community for the benefit of others, to learn new skills, to meet new people, and for some, this may lead to ongoing employment.
