Last year teachers began negotiations for their collective agreement. At Paid Union Meetings at the end of last year, members agreed on a one-day national strike if they felt there was no satisfactory progress with their collective agreement. As such all secondary school teachers in New Zealand will hold a national one-day strike on Thursday 16 March. As no PPTA members will be available for teaching duties on that day it will not be possible to run normal classes.

Community Message from Papanui High School

We wish to bring to your attention a recent email home regarding social media to inform you of a recent harmful social media incident that the school has had to investigate due to its impact on the school and the wider community.

We have been made aware of several Instagram accounts attached to the school's name that were sharing harmful content, including images of our students without their permission. We have worked with Instagram and Netsafe to get the content removed. When incidents like this occur we refer to the school's policy on Responding to Digital Incidents and Bullying, and therefore we have investigated, sought support from Netsafe, made a report to the police, and are now contacting the community to make them aware of the incident.

It is important that we continue to work together to support students to understand the context of such sites. Students should always be mindful of their safety and understand the implications that messages from social media may have on the wider community.

We will continue to monitor social media and hope that these sites do not reappear in a different form and would appreciate contact via admin@papanui.school.nz if you believe that they have.


