JEWELLERY MAKING USING RESIN: Making Pendants and Earrings. Saturday 18 March 9.30am - 12.30pm cost \$100 fee includes the cost of all materials and use of equipment.

CHEESEMAKING: Saturday 18 March 10.00am - 1.00pm cost \$97. This interactive Cheese Demonstration class involves the making and tasting of five soft cheeses. 



Congratulations to Josh Rae whose has already qualified for the SISS Athletics Championships in Invercargill, Josh's events were straight finals on Tuesday.


We look forward to hearing how you get on.
