Kia ora,

We have just completed the penultimate week of Term 1, and are grateful that we have been able to complete the majority of what would have been a normal Term 1 programme pre-Covid. School Uniform Update

School uniform promotes school identity as well as pride and minimises the social pressures of overdressing in a school environment. Wearing our uniform correctly is important for our school tone because it shifts the emphasis from competition back to academic performance, personal achievement, and mutual respect. This is reflected in our school's PRIDE values.

Unfortunately, we have seen a small shift from some students towards the wearing of incorrect uniform items as winter approaches and we are asking caregivers to help us address this before the beginning of Term 2.

Information regarding our school uniform is available on the school <u>website</u>. We have a range of jerseys, cardigans and waterproof or softshell jackets available for purchase and can provide these items for any student that is not able to source their own.

We have also seen this term that there are a small number of students wearing cargo shorts, or trousers, or black shorts, ie faitaga and trousers. These are not part of the regulation school uniform.

Regulation items can be purchased from <u>Mainland Uniforms</u>, online via <u>Withers and Co</u> or from the uniform section of The Warehouse Northlands. Items such as shorts and trousers need to be purchased from the suppliers above or the second-hand uniform store.

Uniform passes

If a student is unable to wear the correct uniform, they can get a uniform pass from their form teacher during form time. The student will need a note from home outlining the issue with the uniform and a timeline for the issue to be rectified, and will likely be offered an item to use for the day or keep. Alternative items worn with a pass need to be as close as possible to the school uniform in colour and design. For example, hoodies or jerseys especially those with bright graphics should not be worn at school if there is a valid reason for not wearing school uniform.

Passes are issued for three lengths of time;

- Long term: for students who have a reason to wear a mutually agreeable alternative to the school uniform.
- Up to 5 days: for students that need the weekend to source a replacement item.
- 1 day, for students that have a wet or lost item that will be wearable the next day.

Please note: starting Week 2 of Term 2 students who are in incorrect uniform without a uniform pass will be expected to attend lunchtime detention which will operate in the same way as our late system.

Speed Build e-Sports Challenge with Minecraft Education

Speed Build e-Sports Challenge with Minecraft Education:

On Friday 24th March Papanui High School hosted a speed build e-Sports Challenge across our Kahui Āko Community of Learning. The MoE have funded a programme promoting student engagement using the Minecraft Education tool with a goal of integration of local curriculum. The aim is to develop a programme of work that supports kaiako, ākonga and rangatahi to build confidence and capability to drive esports within their Kāhui Ako. Teams trained and had practiced a particular build challenge that needed to be completed within a time frame. The content was based on the story of Kupe and Te Wheke.

Our team consisting of Zaden Thompson (Yr10), Harri Faithful (Yr10), Oliver Bao (Yr10), Eddie Lumb (Yr10), Alex Harrow (Yr11), Alex Loader (Yr11), Ryan McCallum (Yr11), Naushin Parveen (Yr11), Alex Maule (Yr11), and Kase Findlater (Yr11) project managed this event planning and implementing it to a very successful outcome.

Ākonga at Yr5 and 6 level competed across four Primary schools within our Kahui Āko (Papanui Primary, Cotswold Mātāhae School, Te Kura o Matarangi Northcote School, Redwood Primary School/Te Kura o te Rakau Whero). This was an exciting event and 'competition was intense. We received many compliments from Principals and teachers from the schools competing about how our students conducted themselves in their leadership roles and the professional manner with which they interacted with their tamariki. 
Winter Sport
