Principal's Perspective

Kia ora,

Welcome to our first newsletter following the holidays. The students were treated to some good weather, so hopefully they have had a restful break, and are returning recharged and focussed on the term ahead.

On Monday 24th we held the Ministry of Education's Staff Only Day focussed on the NCEA Change Programme. Immediately prior to this we received the announcement that the NCEA timelines were being amended to support the effective development of knowledge and resources alongside an extended timeline. This means the new NCEA Level 1 programme will be fully implemented in 2024 as planned, including the Literacy and Numeracy changes, but Level 2 will now be implemented in 2026 (instead of 2025) and Level 3 will be 2027 (instead of 2026). Fortunately we had Jackie Brown from ImpactED who specializes in the NCEA Change Programme work with our staff in the morning, to support the development of our Level 1 teaching and learning programmes.

OPEN NIGHT will be held on Wednesday 17th May from 6.30pm. This will include preparatory visits to our major contributing schools involving some current Year 9 students (who visit the school they came from), and members of the Head Student team. These visits begin in Week 3, with a focus on informing potential incoming students of the values and opportunities that Papanui High School can offer, and to encourage them to attend Open Night with their families/caregivers

BUILDING UPDATE

During the holiday period significant progress has been made in relation to the structural framework of Westhub. Noticeably, the first floor foundation has been poured, and stairs have gone in giving access to the top floor.

Photos will remain available for purchase throughout the year although a delivery fee will now be charged, and orders will be posted home direct from Photolife.

Please also note that group photos for Aiga, Whānau, Kimi ora and Adult Esol will take place on Monday the 1st of May and will be available to order using the same system but a new ordering code which will be emailed home Week 3 or 4.

School Uniform Update

School uniform promotes school identity as well as pride and minimises the social pressures of overdressing in a school environment. Wearing our uniform correctly is important for our school tone because it shifts the emphasis from competition back to academic performance, personal achievement, and mutual respect. This is reflected in our school's PRIDE values.

Unfortunately, we have seen a small shift from some students towards the wearing of incorrect uniform items as winter approaches and we are asking caregivers to help us address this before the beginning of Term 2.

Information regarding our school uniform is available on the school <u>website</u>. We have a range of jerseys, cardigans and waterproof or softshell jackets available for purchase and can provide these items for any student that is not able to source their own.

We have also seen this term that there are a small number of students wearing cargo shorts, or trousers, or black shorts, ie faitaga and trousers. These are not part of the regulation school uniform.

Regulation items can be purchased from <u>Mainland Uniforms</u>, online via <u>Withers and Co</u> or from the uniform section of The Warehouse Northlands. Items such as shorts and trousers need to be purchased from the suppliers above or the second-hand uniform store.

Uniform passes

If a student is unable to wear the correct uniform, they can get a uniform pass from their form teacher during form time. The student will need a note from home outlining the issue with the uniform and a timeline for the issue to be rectified, and will likely be offered an item to use for the day or keep. Alternative items worn with a pass need to be as close as possible to the school uniform in colour and design. For example, hoodies or jerseys especially those with bright graphics should not be worn at school if there is a valid reason for not wearing school uniform.

Passes are issued for three lengths of time;

- Long term: for students who have a reason to wear a mutually agreeable alternative to the school uniform.
- Up to 5 days: for students that need the weekend to source a replacement item.
- 1 day, for students that have a wet or lost item that will be wearable the next day.

Please note: starting Week 2 of Term 2 students who are in incorrect uniform without a uniform pass will be expected to attend lunchtime detention which will operate in the same way as our late system.


The evening will consist of an address from the principal and student representatives, followed by guided tours of the school's facilities.


