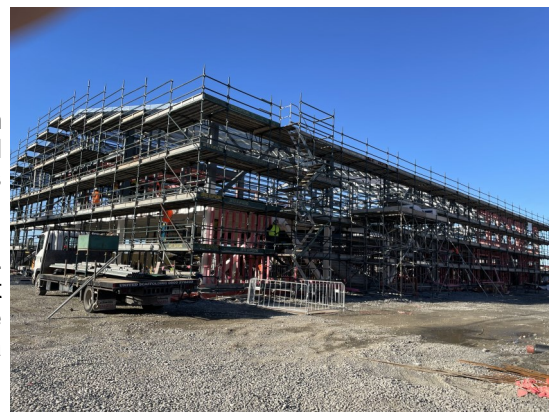

Great progress has been made on Westhub, with all the steel framing in place, first floor now in place, and if you look closely at the picture you will see the wooden internal framing starting to be put in place. Next week it is expected that the foundation will be poured for Easthub.

Events like school productions provide a range of opportunities for student involvement to display their specific set of skills that help contribute to the event. 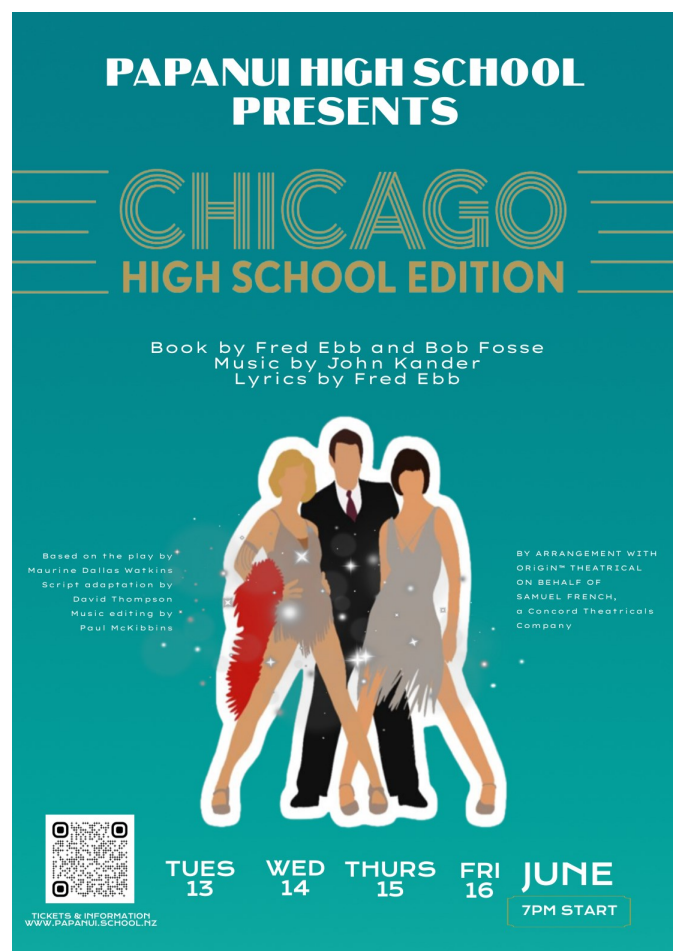
