The path upgrade works planned for a short section of the Northern Line Cycleway will not go ahead on Monday 25 September, as stated in our previous edition.

Due to unforeseen utility works blocking access and work areas, the Christchurch City Council have had to postpone the commencement of the path upgrade works between Langdons Road and Sawyers Arms Road rail crossings. Dance brings me peace of mind and grounds me when I am feeling stressed. Dance is my second home and it brings me so much joy!


