# **Principal's Perspective**

Kia ora,

This week the first two of four Year 10 Outdoor Education Camps took place up at Cragieburn. I was very fortunate to be able to attend the first camp. We were treated to near perfect weather. I am very appreciative of the staff who run these camps, and it was wonderful to see the students so actively engaged in the authentic outdoor environment.

The final PTA meeting for the year was held on Monday. I would like to thank the parents who are involved for their continued support of the school. Whether it be helping out at the various events we hold, running uniform sales, raising funds to support students, or being a sounding board for ideas and initiatives, your input is greatly appreciated. 
# **Junior Work Day**

# **Free Dental Care**


