

Kia-ora! Good morning, everyone, on behalf of all the ESOL class students, I would like to thank everyone, teachers, students, and administration staff who support us and make our stay comfortable at Papanui high school.



Although I've studied here only for 1 year, it was a great experience for me. I've learned a lot not only English but also about New Zealand culture and the local community. One of my favourite days of the week is when we go on an outing every Tuesday. We have been many different places from the beach to the theatre. When we went to Waimairi Life Saving club, I heard that one of our students had never seen the sea. That must have been an emotional moment for her. We also went to the cinema to watch a New Zealand film which was my first time watching a movie about New Zealand. I've learned about NZ history of the Springbok tour through this. And I can see all the efforts made for the equality and freedom of this country. I also enjoyed the sense of kiwi humour.


Another positive part of my experience here was meeting people. It was wonderful to meet a variety of people from all over the countries that gave me a chance to get a glimpse of diverse cultures by interacting with them. Now I see the World as an open mind. All the experiences here have helped me to widen my perspectives around different countries. So, I really appreciate all people that shared their thoughts and experiences with me.

To show you how much this ESOL class means for our students, I would like to talk about one of my classmates. He has been living in New Zealand for over 30 years. But he never had a chance to learn English before until this year. He has worked so hard this year, as he was the first one to arrive in the mornings to revise what he has learnt the day before, for example, working on his vocabulary. He showed his passion of learning by never missing one class during the whole year.

Before he started to learn English, he always needed his daughter's assistance when he needed to communicate in English. But now he has built the confidence to try communicating by himself. I remembered what he said, "I was stuck working in the kitchen for 30 years and now I've got a chance to study English. I really appreciate the chance to be here, and I am glad to study hard."

I also noticed another student who started in this program 4 years ago. At first, she was in the beginner class. And now she is in the highest class. She has made huge progress with her diligence and passion.

This ESOL class helps us to settle in NZ and to feel as part of the community, but also it is a starting point for a better future in life. So, we really thank you all for supporting us. I will never forget this valuable experiences. Thank you so much again.





MĀORI EDUCATION TRUST 2024 SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships and Criteria

Edward Carlton Holmes Memorial Scholarship

Open to those who whakapapa to a hapū or marae of the Wairarapa Tāmaki Nui a Rua Rohe and are registered to the Ngāti Kahungunu Ki Wairarapa Tāmaki Nui-A-Rua Settlement Trust.

Māori Education Trust Secondary Boarding Scholarship

Available to Māori boarding students with demonstrated financial need, academic ability, and aptitude, enrolled at Māori secondary boarding schools.

Māori Education Trust Years 10 to 13 Scholarship

Available to Years 10 to 13 Māori students with demonstrated financial need.

Otaki and Porirua Trusts Board Scholarship

Open to beneficiaries registered with Ngāti Raukawa, Ngāti Toa or Te Atiawa.

RJ Graham Scholarship

Available to Years 12 and Year 13 Māori students with academic merit studying Te Reo Māori. Priority will be given to students also studying mathematics, information technology or science. (Science is defined as physics, chemistry or biology.)

Rose Hellaby Scholarship

Available to Year 9 Maori students with demonstrated financial need, academic ability and aptitude.

Sister Annie Henry Scholarship

Available to Māori students who are a direct descendant of Reverend John George Laughton or of Tūhoe descent.

Tangiharuru Apa Trust Secondary Scholarship

Available to secondary tauira who are descendants of Tangiharuru or Apa.

Tī Maru Māori Trust Secondary Boarding Scholarship

Available to Year 9 Māori students with demonstrated financial need, academic ability and aptitude, who attend a secondary boarding school.

VW & LM Rosier Scholarship

Available to Year 13 Māori students with demonstrated financial need and NCEA Level 2 with Merit or Excellence Endorsement.


Reminder to all rangatahi and their whānau that Year 9 to 18th Birthday "Free Dental" is available, book in with your dentist for your yearly check-up.
